

CITY UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' UNION CONSTITUTION

Section B : Membership

1. The following shall be members provided that they abide by the Constitution and Regulations and Schedules of the Union in force at the time:
 - (a) As Ordinary members all students registered for a course of study at the University and all Sabbatical Officers of the Union who shall be entitled:
 - (i) To hold office and stand for election where provided for in the Regulations and Schedules;
 - (ii) To attend all meetings and social functions of the Union;
 - (iii) To vote at all elections and meetings of the Union where provided for in the Regulations and Schedules;
 - (iv) To join all affiliated Clubs and Societies.
 - (b) As Honorary Members all members of the University Council, the University staff, the Convocation, and the Union staff, who shall be entitled:
 - (i) To attend all meetings and social functions of the Union;
 - (ii) To join but not hold office in all affiliated Clubs and Societies of the Union.The Honorary Membership shall cease when the person leaves the body, which entitles him or her to Honorary Membership.
 - (c) As Honorary Life Members all past Sabbatical Officers of the Union and Carrot Holders, who shall be entitled:
 - (i) To attend all meetings and social functions of the Union;
 - (ii) To join but not hold office in all affiliated Clubs and Societies of the Union.
 - (d) Associate members are those persons who do not fulfil the criteria for Ordinary Membership such as City University Alumni and who have not elected to refuse membership. Associate members shall be admitted on such terms and conditions as are laid down in the Regulations and Schedules. Associate members shall be entitled:
 - (i) To use the Union's general facilities in accordance with the conditions laid down in the regulations and Schedules;
 - (ii) To attend all meetings and social functions of the Union;
 - (iii) to join but not hold office in all affiliated Clubs and Societies of the Union.
 - (e) The Union may enter into reciprocal membership with other colleges, whose members shall be Reciprocal Members, who shall be entitled:
 - (i) To use the Union's general facilities in accordance with the conditions laid down;
 - (ii) To use a Club's or Society's facilities and equipment with the permission of the Club or Society.

Any member may use the Union's facilities and services in accordance with the Occupancy Agreement between the Council of the University and the Union. In the use of the Union's facilities and services all members shall act in accordance with the Union's Equal Opportunities Policy.

The Union may at any time impose such restrictions or conditions on the use of Union facilities by members, as it may deem necessary.

2. Any student may elect not to be a member of the Union by giving notice in writing to the President. A student having so elected shall not be eligible subsequently to become a member until the commencement of the next academic year and shall notify the President in writing of that intention. A student not a member of the Union shall nevertheless have access to and use of those facilities and privileges that are accorded to Associate members as defined in Regulation A.
